

GUIDELINES FOR SUNDAY SCHOOL TEACHERS

1. All Sunday School personnel are expected to be in Sunday morning staff devotions.
2. Sunday School Teachers will be asked to serve for one (1) year upon which there will be a review of the Sunday School Program and possible teacher changes.
3. Please notify Sunday School Superintendent at least one (1) week in advance if you will be absent during Sunday School.
4. In case of sickness or emergency, call Sunday School Superintendent as soon as possible, so a substitute can be arranged.
5. It is expected that when any teacher is to be absent from any service (except the Sunday School hour) he or she is to notify the pastor.
6. All male Sunday School teachers must keep hair well trimmed.
7. Male teachers may not have moustaches or beards.
8. Male Sunday School teachers should wear a white shirt, tie, and suit or sport coat.
9. No gaudy jewelry (such as: earrings, necklaces, excessive and unmeaningful rings) shall be permitted.
10. Women who wear slacks or pant suits either at home or in public will not be permitted to teach. Also, blouses and dresses that expose underarms are unacceptable. Dresses and skirts are to be below the knees.
11. Men who wear clothing in public view that exposes the chest and/or legs shall not be permitted to teach.
12. Teachers shall not wear make-up on face or colored nail polish.
13. Modesty and decency of dress, appearance, and attitude are to be the hallmarks of all who teach.
14. Please assume responsibility for keeping your rooms neat and orderly.
15. Teachers shall not have television in their home, except there is an unsaved husband or wife involved who insists on it.
16. Plan weekly lessons in advance. NEVER wait until Sunday morning to look over the lesson.
